Gisborne is located on the East Coast of the North Island of New Zealand. International flights arrive at Auckland International Airport. Gisborne is under one hour's flight from the Auckland Domestic Terminal. There are taxis and free buses from the International Terminal to the Domestic Terminal, or it is a 10 minute walk. There is a Meet and Greet service available. There are four flights a day to Gisborne.





FAR EAST.

Gisborne is the first city in the world to see the sunrise each day. The city has a population of 45,000 people. It has a busy port, a variety of shops, restaurants, hotels, and recreational facilities. The region is famous for its warm sunny climate, its variety of locally grown fruits and vegetables, and the miles of magnificent surf beaches. Surrounding the district are picturesque rainforests and mountains, perfect for outdoor adventures.

LEARN TO SURF.

Learn to surf with a professional coach.

Cost: \$240 per month (3 months course recommended). This covers coaching and surfboard hire. The course is dependent on weather and surf conditions. Students will need to purchase a wetsuit. Surf shops are in Gisborne (about \$400 for a quality wetsuit which your coach will help you buy). Students are required to be physically fit and sign a Surfing Activity Liability Form.
